## **Proposed Action and Alternatives**

The United States Air Force (USAF) is proposing to modify airspace associated with Mountain Home

Air Force Base (AFB). Modifying this airspace will allow the USAF to provide a more realistic and efficient airspace training environment for aircrews and improve aircrew proficiency in low-altitude tactics and radar masking using mountainous terrain for survival in a highly contested environment.

The proposed airspace changes include: 1) changing low-altitude airspace floors that currently prohibit realistic low-altitude training

certification and maintenance training and negatively impact vertical capability and capacity,

can realistically train on evasive maneuvers.

2) providing consistent low-level operational floors for low-altitude flights to allow use of topographic features of mountainous terrain to mask the aircraft and safely neutralize or avoid technologically advanced threats, and 3) allowing aircrews to descend at supersonic speed and to fly at lower supersonic altitudes so they
